President's Report **Council Meeting of Tuesday, October 2, 2019**

Good afternoon Council Members, Ladies and Gentlemen:

FISHERIES DECLARATION - US Secretary of Commerce Wilbur Ross declared “a catastrophic regional fishery disaster occurred for Louisiana, Mississippi, and Alabama due to extreme flooding events in the Gulf of Mexico.” With the declaration, commercial fishermen who have incurred verifiable losses will be eligible for NOAA fisheries disaster assistance. St. Bernard Fisheries Task Force, which included parish officials and leaders in the local commercial fishing community, and officials with the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries met with members of Congress and the Trump Administration to seek a disaster declaration due to multiple openings of the Bonnet Carré spillway that poured Mississippi River floodwaters into St. Bernard Parish’s estuaries and the Mississippi Sound.

REDFISH FESTIVAL – The Inaugural Redfish Festival was held this past weekend on the grounds of the Sigur Civic Center. Congratulations to all of the winners of the Redfish Tournament.

RECREATION – Soccer games began this past weekend. A total of 290 Soccer games will be played during the regular season which runs through November. We look forward to a great season and encourage everyone to come out and support our kids.
