President's Report **Council Meeting of Tuesday, March 6, 2018**

Good evening Council Members, Ladies and Gentlemen:

Coastal – The Louisiana Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority (CPRA) recently awarded St. Bernard Parish Government a \$2,781,000 RESTORE Act Parish Matching Program grant to construct the Lake Lery Marsh Creation (Phase 2) project. The St. Bernard Parish Government Coastal Division submitted the project proposal, which includes the restoration and nourishment of approximately 40 acres of marsh near Delacroix, to the CPRA for consideration in 2017.

Finance – Louisiana State Auditors have begun their yearly audit of the Housing Office. The Department is updating the 2016 Financial Policy to be in compliance with the Department of Treasury.
