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**PUBLIC NOTICE**

**HOUSING CHOICE VOUCHER WAITING LIST REOPENS**

The St. Bernard Parish Government Housing and Redevelopment Department (SBPHR) announces its Housing Choice Voucher program wait-list will open on **Thursday, September 1, 2022**. The program provides funds through the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to pay a portion of monthly rent for qualifying families in SBPHR’s jurisdiction.

**SBPHR will accept online pre-applications for the waiting list beginning at 8 a.m., Central Time, on Thursday, September 01, 2022, to 5 p.m., Central Time, Wednesday, September 07, 2022.**

Of the applications received, SBPHR will use a lottery system to randomly select 500 applicants for placement on the wait-list. Everyone has the same chance of being chosen whether they apply on the first day or the last day. SBPHR’s voucher program operates only in St. Bernard Parish. To apply online during the open period, complete a pre-application at <https://www.waitlistcheck.com/LA978>. **All applications must be received through the online application tool. No mailed, faxed, hand-delivered or emailed applications will be accepted.**

Individuals with a disability that prevents them from applying online may call 504-278-4468 to make special arrangements with staff to help them complete the application in time and to be included in the lottery process. All such requests must be made by 5 p.m., Central Time, on Monday, September 05, 2022.

Applicants who do not have access to the internet can look to local resources such as a computer at their local library.

If you don’t receive an acknowledgment from the system that your application has been successfully submitted, your application will not be assigned a lottery number. Placement on the waiting list does not mean that an applicant is in fact eligible for assistance.

**Applicants must be considered very low-income, which means that their gross annual income must be at or below 50% of the area median income (AMI).**
